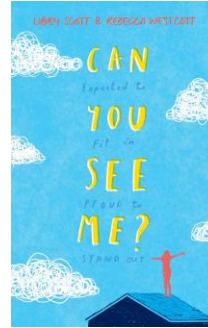
In PE this half term we will be doing athletics. We will also be attending a cricket festival.

Our class novel this half term is:

In English we will learn:

How to write a persuasive piece of writing. This will link to our Geography unit this term and will aim to persuade people to visit France!

In Music we will learn:

How does music connect us with the environment?

Our focus is stage and screen and we will be listening to music composed by John Williams.

In Science we will learn:

Living things and their habitats.

We will recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.

Explore and use classification keys.

Recognise that environments can change, and this can pose a danger to living things.

In Maths we will learn about:

Time (continued from Summer 1)

Children in Year 3 will learn to tell the time to 5 minutes, to the minute, read time on a digital clock and use a.m and p.m.

Children in Year 4, will recap knowledge gained from Year 3, whilst using that knowledge to apply it to the 24-hour clock.

Properties of Shape

Children in Year 3 will look at different type's angles, including how to use a protractor and draw angles correctly. Children in Year 4 will look at quadrilaterals, polygons and lines of symmetry.

Fractions (Decimals)

We will look at tenths and hundredths as a decimal and how to divide one- and two-digit numbers by 10 and 100.

In RE we will learn:

Why people still visit Durham Cathedral today and relate this unit back to what we learnt in KS1. We will also look at the significance of local Saints such as St Aiden, St Bede and St Cuthbert. We will look at their characteristics, and what impact they had on the Christian religion.
