



In English we will learn to:

- Use finger spaces, capital letters and full stops when writing sentences
- Use adjectives and conjunctions to write a story
- Search for and find information in texts to answer questions

This half term we will use Quest by Aaron Becker as a prompt for our writing. We will read lots of other books for pleasure in class story time.

In Art we will learn to:

- use a variety of different tools including pencils, rubbers, crayons, pastels, felt tips, charcoal, chalk and other dry media
- use a sketchbook to gather and collect artwork
- begin to explore the use of line shape and colour

In PSHE we will learn to:

- recognise who to trust and not to trust
- how to judge when a friendship is making us feel unhappy or uncomfortable
- manage conflict
- how to seek help or advice from others
- respect one another

What will we be learning? Year 2 Poplar Autumn 1

In Music we will learn to:

- find and keep a steady pulse
- play or clap simple rhythmic patterns using long and short sounds
- respond to different pitches
- keep a steady beat when improvising
- improvise using one, two or three notes
- listen and move to music carefully
- respond to questions using musical language

In RE we will answer the questions:

- Why is the Bible important for Christians?
- What does it mean to belong to Christianity?

In Science we will learn to:

- identify and discuss the uses of everyday materials
- identify different materials that can be used for the same things
- Identify suitable and unsuitable properties of materials for different purposes
- find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

In Maths we will learn to:

- use tens and ones to help us count
- use place value charts
- recognise and write numbers as words to 100
- estimate numbers on a number line
- compare objects and numbers
- count in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s

In Geography we will learn to:

- draw and label pictures to show location
- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to physical and human features such as: town, city, river, bridge, forest, sea
- use directional language to describe a route (left, right, next to, behind, in front of)
- make a simple map
- use photos to locate a familiar place.
- draw simple sketches
- observe and record information about the local area
- look at a simple map of the local area and identify the things and have seen

In Computing we will learn to:

- develop our basic typing skills
- find My Documents using the Windows icon
- learn how to create and rename folders
- learn how to stay safe online
